

From the Director of Graduate Studies

During the Spring 2025 semester, the English department basked in the glow of its graduate students' many achievements. Please do read the list of awards in this newsletter to learn about their research and teaching successes.

This academic year also saw the arrival of the first U2G students — the senior undergraduates admitted to the MA in Literary Studies who will earn both the BA and the MA degree in five years. Prof. Kathy Lavezzo, the U2G director, ably guided this first cohort through their first graduate courses, steering them toward their Spring 2025 BA graduations and the MA year that begins in the Fall. We are looking forward to welcoming four new U2Gs, one MA, six doctoral students, and ten MFAs (Nonfiction Writing Program) in Fall 2025.

The program also faced new challenges: the federal government's drastic cuts to academic research funding have destabilized graduate programs nationwide, and the revocation of international student visas caused severe stress and anxiety within and across UI programs. (As I write, federal courts have temporarily blocked both the funding cuts and the visa cancellations.) Confronting these problems has required the assistance and commitment of our entire community. I am deeply grateful to the graduate students, faculty, and staff who participated in the information sessions and other meetings dedicated to these concerns.

At the department level, we are working through the process of doctoral exam reform, which will bring our program in line with our Big Ten peers. The AGSE officers have been crucial contributors to this process, and for that — among many other things — I am grateful to them.

Finally, as many of you know, I am leaving this position and UI this summer for the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. The decision to take a new position was a difficult one; leaving you all will be the hardest part of the move, by far. I do know, however, that the graduate programs are in excellent hands.
